

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE RIGHT TO EDUCATION FOR DESPOGI/LGBTI STUDENTS

This assessment is based on 340 responses on the GALE checklist from 110 countries, during 2012-2015. From countries typified as unknown responses still have to be recruited.

The GALE checklist is based on the general consensus of states on the right to education as codified in major conventions

Does the state secure that:

The position of DESPOGI students in schools

- 1. DESPOGI students have full access to educational institutions
- 2. DESPOGI students have freedom of selfexpression in school
- 3. DESPOGI students are protected against bullying and harassment
- DESPOGI students are supported to prevent drop-out
- DESPOGI students are supported to have an equal level of academic performance

The availability of supportive curricula





Three key areas of the right to education






